the origin story of how a student with hearing loss and a hearing aid became a superhero.


Just stop by the front desk to pick up your copy. There's no sign up so just show up!

Ina Garten's Provencal **Cherry Tomato Gratin**

3 pints cherry or grape tomatoes, halved 1 1/2 Tbsp. plus 1/4 cup olive oil 1 tsp. dried thyme Kosher salt and ground black pepper 3 large garlic cloves, peeled 1/3 cup chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley 2 cups coarse bread cubes

Preheat the oven the 400°. Place the tomatoes in a 9x13-inch ceramic dish. Add the 1 ½ tablespoons of olive oil, thyme, 1 teaspoon salt, and ½ teaspoon pepper and toss together. Spread the tomatoes evenly in the pan. Place the garlic, parsley, and ½ teaspoon salt in the bowl of a food processor fitted with the steel blade and process until the garlic is finely chopped. Add the bread cubes and process until the bread is in crumbs. Add the 1/4 cup of olive oil and pulse a few times to blend. Sprinkle the crumbs evenly over the tomatoes. Bake the gratin for 40-45 minutes until the
