Annette Cheney, Catalog Specialist

My primary job at USCL is to catalog materials which are continuously added to the Library's collection. I create a database record of each item which allows our patrons to be able to check out the materials and our Library to keep track of the materials in our system. My work as the main cataloger of a team, known as teamcat (teamca@seolibraries.org), involves processing material, adding library identification labels and protective covers, and repairing damaged material. My other responsibilities include processing memorial and honor donations, maintaining the Heritage Room collection, compiling the new books list for the newspaper, and producing content about the new books for USCL's social media accounts. You may also see me behind the circulation desk working with patrons.

One of my co-workers recently told me that she was inspired with ideas when she was in the Library. My favorite part of my job is sharing with our patrons the vast wealth of our collection and program offerings through the use of our display spaces, creating fantasy in many and varied ways and inspiring patrons in the same way my co-worker was inspired: with new ideas to explore!
