If you're in 5th-8th grade and love to read and hang out with others readers just like you, then Middle School Book Club is perfect for you!



Green Beans with Garlic-Herb Yogurt



- 1/2 cup whole-milk plain Greek yogurt
- ¼ cup finely chopped fresh chives
- 2 Tbsp. finely chopped fresh mint
- 2 Tbsp. finely chopped fresh dill
- 2 Tbsp. lemon juice
- 1 Tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 tsp. honey
- 1 medium garlic clove, finely grated
- 3 Tbsp. salted butter, cut into 2 or 3 pieces
- Kosher salt and ground black pepper
- 1 ½ lbs. green beans, trimmed

In a medium bowl, stir together the yogurt, dill, chives, chopped mint, lemon juice, honey and garlic. Season with salt and pepper; set aside. In a Dutch oven over medium-high, bring the butter, ½ cup water and ½ teaspoon salt to a boil. Stir in the green beans, then cover and cook until just tender when pierced with the tip of the knife, about 5 minutes; stir once about halfway through. Uncover, increase to high and cook, stirring occasionally, until the water evaporates and the beans begin to sizzle, about 5 minutes.

Transfer the beans to a platter. Drizzle with the yogurt mixture and sprinkle with the torn mint.
